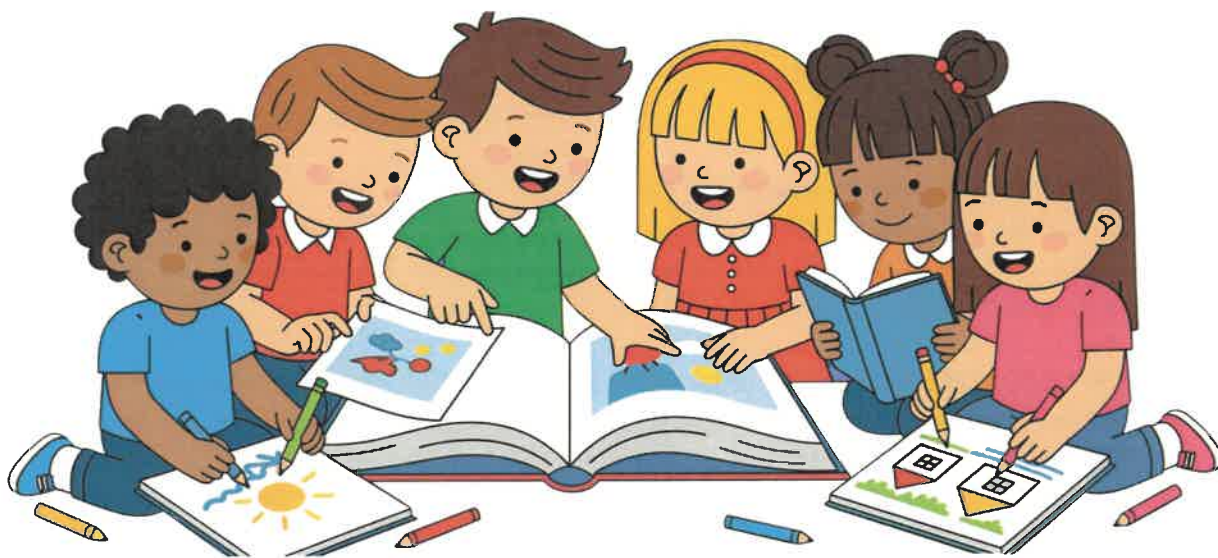
Breakfast Club
